

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BRITISH ENGLISH vs AMERICAN ENGLISH

There are a few grammatical differences between the two varieties of English. Let's start with collective nouns. We use collective nouns to refer to a group of individuals

In American English, collective nouns are singular. For example, staff refers to a group of employees; band refers to a group of musicians; team refers to a group of athletes. Americans would say, "The band is good."

But in British English, collective nouns can be singular or plural. You might hear someone from Britain say, "The team are playing tonight" or "The team is playing tonight."

THE THIRD CHILD IN THE BUCKINGHAM PALACE!



Princess Kate and Prince William officially confirmed that they expect the third child to be born. Journalists have discovered that Kate will give birth to a girl. Besides this message, nothing was known. As reported by British journalists, the third child of Princess Kate and Prince William will be born between March and May. Apparently, as with Charlotte and George, the Duchess will have at her disposal the wing of London's St. John's Hospital. Mary. Thanks to that, she will be able to live happier moments away from photojournalists. The speculation about the third child of Kate and William is also ongoing. Interestingly, the bookmakers have some of their proposals. In his opinion, the third "Royal Baby" will bear one of the following names: Alice, Alexander, Elizabeth or Victoria.

Buckingham Palace has published a new photo of Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip on the occasion of their 70th wedding anniversary.

The couple was married in London's Westminster Cathedral on November 20, 1947, just two years after the end of World War II. Numerous distinguished guests, diplomats and representatives of royal families from all over the world attended the ceremony.

In the latest photo, Elizabeth II is dressed in the same dress she chose for the solemn mass of thanksgiving in the Cathedral on the 50th wedding anniversary of Prince Philip. The queen has a scarab-shaped brooch made of yellow gold and decorated with ruby and diamond, which she received as a gift from her husband in 1966.

The queen and prince will be celebrating their platinum family with their children and grandchildren. There is a festive toast and dinner in Windsor. At 13.00, the bells of the Westminster Cathedral will sound.

In 2015, Queen Elizabeth II became the longest-serving British monarch. Prince Philip - due to his old age - resigned this year from official duties, but is still seen at the side of the queen during some celebrations.



FAMOUS LANDMARKS FROM IRELAND

Cliffs of Moher



A segment of the cliffs of the Atlantic Ocean in the western part of the Republic of Ireland (Clare). The cliff, built of limestone and sandstone, is about 8 km long; At the highest point it reaches the height of 214 m. One of the main tourist attractions of Ireland. In the center is the nineteenth-century tower - O'Brian's Tower. This is the highest point of the Mohair Cliffs, and the landscapes are the most spectacular. Visitors are open, open in 2007, visitor center. Those interested in it will find a lot of information about the cliffs presented during the multimedia presentations. In addition, there are catering facilities and souvenir shops. Guests can also take advantage of the offer of nearby companies offering boat cruises along the cliffs.

Aran Islands

Staying in the west of Ireland, it is worth visiting the Gal-

way Bay and Aran Islands Atlantic Ocean. They are famous

fort - Dún Aonghasa, considered the "greatest barbarian monument in Europe". It is located on the edge of a 100 meter cliff, making it a great place to enjoy breathtaking landscapes - on a clear day you can see 120 km away.

Visiting Arany is worth seeing the Black Fort, the O'Brien's fourteenth century castle (O'Brien's Castle), probably the world's smallest church - Tempull Bheanáin.

Killarney National Park

is a very spectacular land of mountains, forests of lakes and wetlands. There is the highest mountain range in Ireland, with peaks reaching over 1000 m. The slopes are covered with forests, and at the foot of the lake are beautiful lakes - they are particularly spectacular from the many scenic spots along the road leading to the park at a considerable height. The present forests of Killarney are a remnant of the ancient wilderness that once covered much of Ireland.

The Yew tree is one of only three in Europe. This is a place where you can return many times for one-day trips, and for the whole visit you have to spend a few days. Torc Waterfall, the picturesque Dunloe gorge, the medieval defensive tower - Ross Castle, or the ruins of the 7th century monastery in Inisfallen are among the more interesting. But the most popular place is Muckross House - a 19th century Victorian palazzo, along with its impressive gardens. There is a carriage ride along the Killarney Park and boat trips on the lake.



Lakes.

Glendalough is a picturesque valley and a sixth-century settlement of the same name. The site is rich in early Christian monuments, such as the stone tower towering over the landscape (the refuge of the inhabitants during the raids) or the nearby cemetery (the resting place of many victims of the Great Famine). When visiting Glendalough, you can also take a tour of the charming Wicklow Mountains (glendalough views and nearby lakes), where you will find chamois and, in summer, enjoy the blueberries. In the vicinity

you can also visit Powerscourt Waterfall and Powerscourt Gardens - recommended especially during spring flowering azaleas.

Blarney Castle

Blarney's medieval castle and impressive gardens are one of the treasures of Ireland. When visiting Blarney, join 400,000 people kissing the "Stone of eloquence". Legend has it that this month will never run out of words on a special topic. Wishing Steps are waiting for you at a fast pace, near the castle. With your eyes closed go down the stairs and then back up and regret that you will not think about it, will be completed within a year. Only you won't break your leg, because there is a Druid altar in the area, a prehistoric tomb - Dolmen, the Witch's Stone and many other sights and monuments, all contained in a beautifully maintained castle park.

Giant's Causeway



The Giant's Causeway is an area of about 40,000 interlocking basalt columns, the result of an ancient volcanic eruption. It is located in County Antrim on the north coast of Northern Ireland, about three miles northeast of the town of Bushmills.

Much of the Giant's Causeway and Causeway Coast World Heritage Site is today owned and managed by the National Trust and it is one of the most popular tourist attractions in Northern Ireland. It was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1986, and a national nature reserve in 1987 by the Department of the Environment for Northern Ireland. In a 2005 poll of Radio Times readers, the Giant's Causeway was named as the fourth greatest natural wonder in the United Kingdom. The tops of the columns form stepping stones that lead from the cliff foot and disappear under the sea. The tallest are about 12 metres high, and the solidified lava in the cliffs is 28 metres thick in places.

Newgrange

Newgrange (Irish: Sí an Brú or Brú na Bóinne) is a prehistoric monument in County Meath, Ire-

land, located 8 kilometres west of Drogheda. Some academics suggest it was built during the Neolithic period, around 3200 BC, making it earlier than Stonehenge and the Egyptian pyramids. The site consists of a large circular mound with an inner stone passageway and chambers. Human bones and possible grave goods were found in these chambers.



During the medieval period, Newgrange and the wider Brú na Bóinne Neolithic complex gained various attributes in local folklore, which was often connected to figures from wider Irish mythology. The monuments of the Brú were thought of by some as being the abode of the supernatural Tuatha De Danann, whilst others considered them to be the burial mounds of the ancient kings of Tara.

Interestingly, the central chamber of the tomb is illuminated with a beam of sunlight only once a year for about 15 minutes

Dublin

Dublin is the capital and largest city of Ireland. Dublin is in the province of Leinster on the east coast of Ireland, at the mouth of the River Liffey and bordered on the South by the Wicklow Moun-



tains. Founded as a Viking settlement, the Kingdom of Dublin became Ireland's principal city following the Norman invasion. The city expanded rapidly from the 17th century.

Dublin has many landmarks and monuments dating back hundreds of years. One of the oldest is Dublin Castle, which was first founded as a major defensive work on the orders of England's King John in 1204, shortly after the Norman invasion of Ireland in 1169, when it was commanded that a castle be built with strong walls and good ditches for the defence of the city.

One of Dublin's newest monuments is the Spire of Dublin, or officially titled "Monument of Light". It is a 121.2-metre conical spire made of stainless steel and is located on O'Connell Street.

The Ha'penny Bridge, an iron footbridge over the River Liffey, is one of the most photographed sights in Dublin and is considered to be one of Dublin's most iconic landmarks.

Other landmarks and monuments include the Mansion House, the Anna Livia monument, Christ Church Cathedral, St Patrick's Cathedral, Saint Francis Xavier Church on Upper Gardiner Street near Mountjoy Square, The Custom House and Áras an Uachtaráin.

ENJOY YOUR MEAL! - SCOTTISH FOOD

Scotland is a pantry of dreams and a bountiful land of plenty in terms of fresh produce. From Scottish salmon to homemade buttery shortbread, we lead you on a culinary tour through its culinary highlights.



1. Haggis

To answer a common question, haggis traditionally consists of sheep's liver, heart and lung minced with suet (fat), onion, oats and spices and encased in sausage casing (sheep stomach originally) for cooking. Sound good? No? I totally get where you're coming from but trust me, haggis is delicious. Readily available in most pubs, butchers and supermarkets and commonly served with mashed potato (tatties) and neeps (turnip) there is nothing flashy about our national dish.



2. Stovies

There are two places you are likely to find stovies in Scotland: A working man's pub; And a late night bakery. Simple in its execution – potatoes, beef, onions, butter/fat and stock confined to one pan – stovies should be served with oatcakes and beetroot. Winter food at its best and my personal favourite.



3. Full Scottish Breakfast

What exactly a breakfast consists of is open to debate but generally you can expect: Bacon, egg, sausage, beans, black pudding, (which I'll get to later) tattie scone, tomato, mushrooms and toast, all washed down with a pot of tea or coffee and orange juice. You know, for vitamin C.



4. Cullen Skink

Representing soups – and fish (shout out to Arbroath Smokies) – Cullen skink consists of smoked haddock, potatoes and onions and is a local speciality of the town of Cullen in the North-East, however, you will find it on many Scottish menus nationwide. This soup is seriously tasty and although quite heavy – depending on the cream, butter and milk content – you will find yourself wanting more. Fresh, toasted bread is not optional – it's mandatory.

5. Pudding



Why not try a pudding? – not to be confused as something sweet as in Scotland we also call dessert ‘pudding.’ Made primarily of blood, varied meat and oatmeal, black pudding is common in Scotland with Stornoway on the Isle of Lewis being particularly famous for having fantastic and good quality pudding. You will also likely find white pudding – without blood – ready to take away as well as red pudding which is similar to black but less common.

6. Cranachan



Ever present on the dessert menu of many Scottish hotels, Cranachan is a crowd pleaser: Cream; honey; whisky-soaked oats and raspberries. I don't know about you, but add a coffee on the side and I'm pretty much sold. One of your five a day as well. Done deal.

8. Curry



Traditional Scottish dishes aside, foreign cuisine is just as much a part of Scotland's identity. With a multi-cultural country comes multi-cultural food; from Polish to Turkish, Scotland boasts a healthy and diverse café/restaurant scene.

7. Rowies



Common throughout the North-East of Scotland, it is said rowies were originally created for sailors going on long journeys out to sea; The high fat content was designed to keep the rowie – also known as a ‘buttery’ – from going stale. Consisting primarily of flour, salt, lard, oil/butter and usually spread with jam, you may need to work a bit harder on the treadmill after a morning rowie. Think of a flat croissant but forget the flat stomach.

Glasgow in particular is famous for a great curry serving up regional classics as well as crossing over to the likes of a haggis pakora. There is some serious quality to be found and at competitive prices so hunting down a good curry house is a must in Scotland. Being that curry is one the nations favourite, you won't be searching for too long.



ARTY CI Z NIEMIEC SÄNGER WINCENT WEISS



Der deutsche Sänger Wincent Weiss wurde am 21. Januar 1993 in Eutin (Schleswig-Holstein) geboren.

Im Jahr 2013 nahm Weiss an der Casting-Show "Deutschland sucht den Superstar" (Staffel 10) teil - er kam unter die Top 30.

Doch der Rückschlag konnte schnell überwunden werden: "Unter meiner Haut", eine Coverversion, die am Klavier aufgenommen und auf "YouTube" hochgeladen wurde, blieb zwar zwei Jahre unentdeckt, doch "Koby Funk" und "DJ Gestört aber Geil" sorgten für den Durchbruch. Der Remix kam 2015 in die Single-Charts

und wurde mit einer "Platin-Schallplatte" ausgezeichnet. Weiss, den viele nur vom Online Radio kannten, veröffentlichte Ende 2015 seine erste Single "Regenbogen". 2016 erhielt er die "Goldene Schallplatte". Ein Jahr später veröffentlichte er "Ir-

gendwas gegen die Stille" - sein erstes Album. Seine CD kletterte auf Platz 3 in den Charts. In der Schweiz landete er auf Platz 4, in Österreich auf Platz 14.

Wincent Weiss, der auch Mitglied der deutschen ESC-Jury im Jahr 2017 war, hat bereits fünf Singles ("Regenbogen", "Musik sein", "Feuerwerk", "Frische Luft" und "Nur ein Herzschlag entfernt") und ein Album ("Irgendwas gegen die Stille") veröffentlicht. Seine beste Single-Platzierung erreichte er mit "Feuerwerk" im Jahr 2017 (Platz 26 in Deutschland); "Musik sein", eine Single, die ein Jahr zuvor veröffentlicht wurde, kam in Deutschland zwar nur auf Platz 27, kletterte aber in Österreich auf Platz 8 und in der Schweiz auf Platz 10.

Wincent Weiss wurde bei den MTV Europe Music Awards 2017 (12.11.) zum "Best German Act" gekürt.
