

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

## NEWS: THIS & THAT ...

Congratulations to all of you and thank you to all who helped in organising this event especially Mrs. Teresa Kozina who gave us money for prizes.






## NEWS: THIS & THAT

A tax on sweet drinks. New recipes in the UK.



The new sweet beverage tax came into force in the United Kingdom. Its purpose is to limit the consumption of sugar by children and reduce obesity among children.

The new tax is set to change this and help reduce sugar intake in England by funding sports programs targeted at children. Tax revenues are also intended for breakfast at schools.

According to government data in England, one third of people going to college are overweight or obese.

The new rules provide for tax-free beverages containing between five and eight grams of sugar per 100 milliliters of tax of 18 pence per liter. The tax increases to 24p per liter for beverages containing more than eight grams of sugar per 100 milliliters.

### Hollywood Sign

The Hollywood Sign (formerly the Hollywoodland Sign) is an American cultural icon and landmark located in Los Angeles, California. The sign is located on the southern side of Mount Lee in Griffith Park, north of the Mulholland Highway, and to the south of the Forest Lawn Memorial Park (Hollywood Hills) cemetery. The sign overlooks Hollywood, Los Angeles. "HOLLYWOOD" is spelled out in 13.4 m-tall, white capital letters and is 107.3 m long. The sign was originally created in 1923 as an advertisement for a local real estate development, but due to increasing recognition and symbolism, the sign was left up. The sign has been a frequent target of pranks and vandalism across the decades, but it has since undergone restora-

tion, including the installation of a security system to deter vandalism.

### Magnolia Manor

Magnolia Manor is a post-bellum manor located in Cairo, Illinois, located in Alexander County. It has been listed on the National Register of Historic Places

since December 17, 1969. The house is operated as a Victorian period historic house museum by the Cairo Historical Association. It is a 14-room red brick house which features double walls intended to keep out the city's famous dampness with their ten-inch airspaces. Inside the home are many original, 19th-century furnishings.

### Plaza Hotel

Plaza Hotel is a landmark 20-story luxury hotel and condominium apartment building in the Midtown Manhattan neighborhood of the borough of Manhattan, New York City. It opened in 1907 and is now owned by an Indian conglomerate, Sahara India Pariwar.

Long the site for famous performers and guests, it has also been the meeting place for important political meetings. The internationally known singers Josephine Baker, Eartha Kitt, Liza Minnelli, Marlene Dietrich, Lena Horne, Andy Williams, The Mills Brothers, Patti Page and Peggy Lee

played the Persian Room. Miles Davis recorded a live album in the Persian Room in 1958.

### McKinley Bridge

The McKinley Bridge is a steel truss bridge across the Mississippi River. It connects northern portions of the city of St. Louis, Missouri with Venice, Illinois. It opened in 1910 and was taken out of service on October 30, 2001. The McKinley Bridge was the first alignment of U.S. Route 66 across the Mississippi. It is commonly assumed that the bridge was named for President William McKinley; but in reality, it was named for the builder, William B. McKinley, chief executive of the Illinois Traction System interurban electric railway, which accessed St. Louis via the bridge.

Holy Trinity Orthodox Cathedral is the cathedral church of the Orthodox Church in America Diocese of the Midwest. It is one of only two churches designed by Louis Sullivan, one of the seminal architects of the late 19th and early 20th centuries. It is listed on the US National Register of Historic Places and is designated a Chicago Landmark

### The Statue of Liberty

The Statue of Liberty is probably the most famous statues all over the world. It is located on a small island in New York Harbor. The statue presents a woman with the torch holding up. The tourists are free to go inside it. Inside the torch may stand about twelve people in the same time, but many more may stand in different part of the whole statue. It is estimated that the statue weighs over 225 tons and it is about 301 feet high.

Many French people contributed the project. They gave a lot of money for the statue. Americans designers projected and erected the base for the statue and then the statue stood on. Then the American people collected the whole sum of money to build the pedestal. However, the French engineer Alexandre Eiffel, who was well-known for designing the Eiffel Tower in Paris, pointed out that the statue would be too heavy to stand the statue on it. The statue stands until these days

and it greets the immigrants who come to the United States. The first thing they saw while entering New York is the Statue of Liberty. It is the symbol of the land of freedom.

### White House

White House -the official residence and workplace of US presidents located in Washington. The name was given to the building on September 14, 1901 by President Roosevelt. Previously, he was called the Presidential Palace, the President House and the Seat of Executive Authorities. In December 1790, President Wa-

shington signed the Act of Congress, stating that the federal government would reside in a district not exceeding ten square miles off the coast of Potomac. President Washington chose, together with the city architect Pierre L'Enfant, the place where the building was to be built. The distributed competition won the architectural design by James Hoban.

The building, located in Washington at 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue, began to be built in October 1792. The ceremonial commissioning took place in 1800. The first president who lived in it was John Adams. Since the introduction of Adams there, every next presidential couple made their own changes in the building's decor.

In its history, the building has experienced two fires. The first in 1814, when it was burned by the British during the British-American war. The second fire broke out in the west wing in 1929 during the Hoover presidency.

### Gejzer Fly

The geyser was created in 1916 as a result of human activity. During the search for groundwater that could enable agricultural production, a well was dug out to the thermal water reservoir. Water is still coming out of the borehole, and the minerals dissolved in it began to precipitate, creating a rock with a height of 3.7 meters. Currently, the water escapes to the surface with a 1.5 m high stream, and the substrate is colonized by algae.

### Mount Rushmore, Black Hills, South Dakota

The most famous American monument - the heads of four presidents engraved in the rock. The construction of the monument lasted 14 years and was commemorated in this way: Geo-

urge Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt and Abraham Lincoln. Every year millions of tourists visit this pla-

giant undertaking - Crazy Horse Memorial, carved in the rock of the head of the most famous commander Dakota. After finishing work, which will last at least several dozen years, Crazy Horse will become the largest monument in the world.

### Times Square

- a square in Midtown Manhattan on Broadway and Seventh Avenue, stretching from street 42 to street 47. This is one of New York's icons. It is famous for a large number of light adverti-



ce, which is not very popular among Native Americans from Dakota, who think that creating a monument is a desecration of holy places. In the vicinity of Mount Rushmore arises another

sing.

Every New Year's Eve in Times Square is organized the celebration of the adoption of the Year. The ceremony with the most popular music stars is broadcast for about 1 billion viewers. New Year's Eve in Times Square is also considered the world's largest. Every year, about 1 million New Yorkers, tourists from other US States and from around the world participate in it. The highlight of the celebration is a 'drop ball', ie dropping a large sphere on one of Times Square's skyscrapers.

When we think of American classics our minds jump to the comforting standbys we grew up with: hot dogs, fried chicken and chocolate chip cookies. Over the years, this cuisine has made such a mark on us that it seems like at some point or the other, everyone has a little love affair with it. With the splash of American grubs all over, it has transformed from delicious to glorious in India too. And this 4th of July weekend, an all-American feast is just what you need to celebrate the nation's endless culinary creativities.



### 1. Apple Pie

The saying is "American as apple pie" for a reason: this sweet treat is a national institution. Forget anybody who will try to tell you pecan or key lime is better, because they are lying. The simple combination of sugar, buttery pastry and tart sliced apples produces a dessert so extraordinary people have devoted their entire lives to perfecting it. For a parti-

cularly excellent example, try the apple pie with added green chilies at the Pie-O-Neer, in Pie Town, New Mexico.

### 2. Clam Chowder

It is basically illegal to visit Boston without trying New





England clam Pizza in Chicago looks and tastes different. The dish is deep, as the name suggests, meaning the crust rises high and allows for an artery-choking volume of cheese and tomato sauce. Unsurprisingly, they call it a "pie". It is not for the lighthearted and should only be attempted while wearing dark clothes or a large napkin. For a particularly authentic meal, pair the pie with sugary soda. You might like to do this at an Uno Pizzeria, which claims to have invented the Italian American hybrid dish in 1943.

### 4. Hominy Grits

Southern food seems to exist in its own universe, and an entire list could be written just focusing on things like chicken and waffles (yes, you read that correctly). So perhaps it's a good idea to just go with one of the basics: hominy grits, which is essentially corn milled into a rough powder and then boiled up with butter or bacon grease. It sounds rough but it's actually sublime. For proof, try Blossom Restaurant in Charleston, South Carolina, which offers Geechie Boy grits with shrimp and andouille sausage. Pair it with brussels sprouts and sweetened ice tea.

### 5. Tacos

Los Angeles is a city with a taqueria on every street corner, basically. With so many Spanish-



speakers it's possible to find anything from greasy nachos on

Venice Beach to exquisite Michoacan-style goat stews. For a good sampler, forget the chain stuff and try El Huarache Azteca, a tiny, no-fuss eatery in the neighbourhood of Highland Park, where menus run the full gamut from fajitas to mole verde and "flautas" – fried crisp taquitos stuffed with chicken. (Guacamole is a no-brainer.) Keep in mind that Mexican food and Tex-Mex are two very different things.

### 6. Breakfast Sausage

Love waking up to the smell of sausages in the morning? Hands

down, it's the best way to kickstart the day. Calling all pork lovers, this American staple goes well with apples, onion, mustard, cabbage and tomatoes. It originated as a way for farmers to make use of as much of their livestock as possible, with dried sage as the key ingredient along with an assortment of spices. Low effort yet luxurious, it's perfect for a hearty breakfast or a Sunday brunch.



Ihr Kennzeichen ist ein als „brachial“ beschriebener Musikstil, den die Bandmitglieder zu Beginn ihrer Karriere selbst als „Tanzmetall“ bezeichneten. Rammstein ist international berühmt für den intensiven Einsatz von pyro-

technischen Elementen während ihrer Live-Shows. Im Zusammenhang mit stark polarisierenden Musikvideos, Liedtexten und Albumcovern zählt Rammstein in der heimischen öffentlichen Wahrnehmung zu den kontrovers besprochenen Bands.

Bis 2015 verkaufte Rammstein international 18 Millionen Tonträger. Die Tourneen der Band sind die weltweit erfolgreichsten Bühnenereignisse von



einer mit deutschsprachigen Liedern auftretenden Musikgruppe. In der internationalen Wahrnehmung zählt Rammstein deshalb als einer der wesentlichen musikalisch-zeitgenössischen „Kulturexporte“ Deutschlands.


